

Community & Service Learning in Argentina

Day 1:

Arrive into Buenos Aires and meet our in-country coordinator. Transfer to accommodation followed by orientation. In the afternoon, the group will embark on a city tour of Buenos Aires, followed by a Welcome Dinner in a typical Argentinian restaurant.

Day 2:

The group will take a crash course in Spanish, followed by a guided tour of the Latin American Art Museum & Museum of Modern Art.

Day 3:

In the morning, the group will start the service-learning portion of their trip. This can include community development, eldercare, environmental conservation, health education, special education, teaching, wildlife conservation, or women's development.



Day 4:

The group will continue the service-learning portion of their trip. In the afternoon, they will take part in a wine tasting class with an English-speaking sommelier to learn about different Argentine wines, the vinification process, and the history of wine in the country. The wines will be paired with traditional Argentine tapas.

Day 5:

The group will continue the service-learning portion of their trip. In the afternoon, the group will have access to a classroom for a lecture/class/check in.

Day 6:

The group will embark on a tour of the Tigre Delta, accompanied by an English-speaking coordinator. In the evening, the group will gather for a group dinner at a typical Argentinian restaurant.

Day 7:

The group will continue the service-learning portion of their trip. In the evening, they will take part in a tango lesson, followed by a full three-course-dinner, followed by a professional tango show.

Day 8:

The group will continue the service-learning portion of their trip. In the afternoon, the group will visit two of world soccer's most iconic stadiums, River Plate's El Monument stadium, and fierce rival Boca Juniors' La Bombonera stadium. Includes entry to the Museo de la Pasion Boquense, and River Plate Museum.

Day 9:

The group will continue the service-learning portion of their trip. In the afternoon, the group will take part in a traditional Argentinian cooking class and mate tasting session.

Day 10:

The group will spend the day at a traditional Argentine 'Dude Ranch'. Includes return transfers, welcome drink and empanada snack, Asado (BBQ) lunch with wine or beer, tour of the estate, Gaucho skill show, typical Argentinian folklore show with live music, and the opportunity to ride a horse

Day 11:

For their final day in Buenos Aires, the group will have a free day to relax, sightsee, or shop for souvenirs. In the evening, there will be a Farewell Dinner in a traditional Argentinian restaurant.

Day 12:

The group will be transferred back to the Airport for their flight home.

Program Features

A. Pre-departure Support

The group will receive comprehensive pre-departure support. World Endeavors staff members will be available to answer questions throughout the process and to assist with pre-departure orientation as requested. Prior to departure, participants will receive a pre-departure handbook, which will cover country-specific information as well as tips and guidelines for a successful international experience.

B. 24-hour Argentina-based support

Our experienced Buenos Aires-based coordinators will be available 24 hours a day to provide support for the group.

C. In-Country Orientation

Upon arriving in Buenos Aires, the group will receive an orientation from our local coordinator in the city. This orientation will introduce them to Argentinian culture, health and safety issues, and the schedule for the program.

D. Group Accommodations

For Students – Shared rooms in a student residence (Separated by gender)
For Faculty – 1 private apartment with 2 bedrooms.

E. Meals

Breakfast is included each day (with the exception of arrival day), as well as some lunches, and two group dinners at local restaurants.

F. In-Country Transportation

Public transportation will be used within Buenos Aires. Private transfers will be used for group activities outside of Buenos Aires.

G. Airport Reception and Drop-off

Transfers to and from Ezeiza International Airport (EZE) International Airport.

H. Crash Course Spanish

Basic Spanish class inclusive of materials.
